Discussion Questions

- How did she feel about moving? How can you tell? (nervous; body language)
- Is it okay to call people names like Ronald Durkin called Molly Lou Melon? (no)
- Did calling people names help Ronald Durkin make friends? (no)
- How did he feel? (foolish)
- What do you think Ronald learned?
- Did Molly Lou Melon forgive Ronald? (yes)
- Did Molly Lou Melon's unique qualities keep her from making friends? (no, she made new friends)

Activity: What Makes Me Unique

- Supplies: page 2, markers
- Talk about how people have similarities and differences. Discuss attributes and abilities that make child unique.
- Guide child to think about their traits and fill out page 2 of this document to notice what makes him/her unique.
