## Yo! Yes? - Reading Guide

Author/Illustrator: Chris Raschka

Themes: making friends, nonverbal communication, empathy

Lesson/Notes: We can be friends with people who are different from us. You will have similarities and differences with all people. We should care about others and be friendly.

## **Discussion Questions**

- [On pages "Me?" "What's up...Not much"] What does his body and facial expression tell us about how he feels?
- What does the boy mean when he says, "Look! Me!" (I can be your friend.)
- How did the boys become friends? (first boy showed he cared by talking to him, asked if he wanted to be friends, agreed, spent time together, etc.)
- How do they feel at the end of the story? (happy, excited)
  - How can you tell? (jumping, smiling, exclamation)

## **Activity: Notice Differences & Similarities**

- Look at the example venn diagram of the characters in the book. Talk about ways they are the same and ways they are different.
  - Children often notice physical differences first. Help them see the character traits as well.
- Talk about one of child's friends (or a peer (s)he has trouble getting along with). Make a chart of similarities and differences.
- Bonus: Practice making a friend. Go to a park, and encourage child to ask someone new to play!
