A Bad Case of Stripes – Reading Guide

Author/Illustrator: David Shannon Themes: be yourself, withstand peer pressure

Lesson/Notes: Camilla learns to risk ridicule and be herself. It can be difficult to stand up for what you believe. It is important to be honest (in a nice way) even if it means being less popular. Unless what someone is doing is wrong or hurtful, it's okay to have different opinions. It makes the world more interesting.

Discussion Questions

- At the beginning of the story, what is Camilla worrying about?
- Does Camilla like lima beans? (yes)
- Why is Camilla saying no to lima beans? (doesn't want to seem strange or different)
- What cures Camilla? (being herself)

Activity: Different Drawings

Supplies: coloring sheet (2 copies), markers

- Direct child to color a picture. Choose only one color marker for child to use.
- Give child a new coloring sheet and offer all the colors.
- Discuss the value of differences.
 - Many colors make the picture more interesting. It is helpful when people share what they think kindly and honestly.
