A Safe Place – Reading Guide

Lesson/Notes: Not recommended for all children. Tells the story of child and mother survivors of abuse finding healing and hope in a shelter/group home. Mentions father's physical aggression toward mother. Preview this book to ensure it is appropriate for the child.

Discussion Questions

- Were Emily and Mama safe at home with Daddy? (No)
- How did Emily and Mama feel at the big white house on the hill?
- Is hitting an okay way to solve problems? How did Jane say to resolve conflicts? (No. Talk it over.)
- What helped Emily feel better? (Teddy, painting, talking with Jane, planting tulip bulbs, asking Mama questions, calling Daddy)
- Do you think the big white house on the hill will help the little boy feel better?

Activity: Paint

Supplies: paint, paintbrush, paper, water

• Emily felt better when she painted and talked with Jane. Encourage child to paint whatever (s)he chooses. Child may like to listen to relaxing instrumental music while painting.
